#### **Hoping to Start a Library**


Our Lady of Peace is giving away a nice selection of books for spiritual reading and also many instructional videos. Feel free to borrow or take from the table in the commons area.



**-NEW- CLERICALISM:** What *isn't* it?? It isn't a vendetta against priests and bishops, or against our Holy Catholic Church. It *is*, as Pope Francis says, "the gravest of sins". Clericalism is an aberration of the roles of both clergy and laity. Rather than being shepherds leading, ministering to, and working with their flock, like our Fr. Jim, the cleric sits on a pedestal of privilege and power while in misplaced piety, the laity defers to them instead of embracing their own God-given role. This culture keeps all of us from fulfilling our calling, it fosters abuse of all kinds, most notably sexual abuse of children and vulnerable people, and it lacks transparency and accountability. Clericalism is systemic and easily creeps in unseen. We need to be aware and to beware, as we shine a light on this abomination. Blessings from your CEASA
