On the Cover

On the cover today is *The Dream of Joseph* painted in 1773 by Anton Raphael Mengs. Mengs was born in 1728 in Bohemia, into an artistic family of German origin. Like many artists during the 1700s, he developed his skills by studying works from the Classical, Renaissance, and Baroque periods; all of which he encountered while traveling in Italy. This painting demonstrates a blending of these styles showing a clearly physically strong but weary St. Joseph, contrasted with the idealized and brightly illuminated form of the angel.

Memorable Moments in Diocesan History

To be published each week of the 200th anniversary liturgical year

From 1660 to 1775, the Brent family, from Virginia's Northern Neck, were colonial Virginia's only prominent open Catholics. The Brents were well educated lawyers and prosperous farmers who brought in priests to say masses on their estate. They were so economically important in the sparsely settled Northern Neck that anti-Catholic laws were usually not enforced in their case.
