The 1850s saw the rise of the American (or Know Nothing) Party, an anti-immigrant political movement which held that obedience to the pope (a foreign ruler) was actually treason. In 1855, two Know Nothings lured Fr. Matthew O'Keefe of Norfolk to a deserted spot, intending to murder him; instead, he pulled two guns out of his robes and placed them under citizen's arrest.

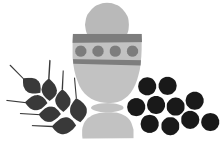
