Popes from Paul III (1530s) to Gregory XVI (1830s) condemned slavery and the slave trade. Sadly, Richmond's Catholics sought social acceptance by distancing themselves from this papal teaching and even, in an August 1835 meeting, publicly supporting slavery.
