During World War II, the Diocese of Richmond quickly expanded its ministries. Thousands of Catholic men from all over America were shipped to Virginia military bases to be trained, and chaplains took on the job of ministering to all of them. The first masses ever said at Blackstone's Memorial Armory and at the auditorium of Farmville State Teachers' College (now Longwood University) were conducted for soldiers stationed nearby. After contact with Catholic service members and chaplains, many Virginians became less hostile to Catholicism.


