The diocese of Richmond's numerical size increased rapidly in the 1950s and 1960s. By 1960, the diocese served 201,844 Catholics, and this growth continued throughout the decade. By the early 1970s, the Vatican concluded that too many Catholics resided in Virginia for the state to continue to be a single diocese. Consequently, in August 1974 Virginia was divided into the two dioceses we know today: the diocese of Richmond (serving the southern half of the state).
