On May 7, 1954, Bishop Ireton made the then-controversial decision to integrate all Catholic schools in the diocese of Richmond. He was the first bishop in the South to order the integration of the schools (others had integrated churches already). After the Supreme Court's Brown vs. Board of Education decision. many Virginia school districts still fought integration through "massive resistance." Bishop Ireton deserves particular credit for ordering integration before the Supreme Court made its decision; our schools were integrated voluntarily, out of conscience.
