Bishop Russell enthusiastically supported the work of the Second Vatican Council, whose reforms in many ways he had already anticipated in our diocese. His primary role in the council itself was to advocate on behalf of the laity and on behalf of worship in the vernacular. His main moment on the council floor occurred when he spoke in favor of including a discussion of “the vocation of the laity to holiness” in the conciliar documents. He also spoke in favor of permitting priests to recite the breviary in English, rather than Latin.

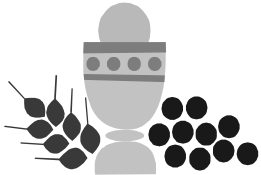

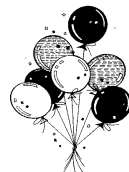

MAC'S Kitchen Spreads the Word With Spot

In our continuing effort to do outreach with the community MAC'S Kitchen will be partnering with Spot "The Book Bus" each Monday in October. The bus will be at Our Lady of Peace Mondays from 10-11 am. There will be books for children, teens and adults available for free. If you have gone through all of your reading materials during the months we have been fighting COVID 19, please stop by and pick up something new to read.

Subject: Migrant Worker Ministry Update

I am remiss in not giving you an update on the work of our ministry and your donated materials, I apologize. But we were fortunate in scheduling visits to all of our camps which opened early in February. We were able to distribute cold weather clothes, towels and blankets to approx. 150 migrant workers at 9 camps who arrived in February and March. We were then shut down by the COVID restrictions and have not visited a camp since. Thank you for the clothes, blankets and towels you donated as all of them were put to good use in the camps.

We had purchased a yearly supply of materials for our Faith Bags: religious items (rosaries prayer cards and bibles) and personal item (soap, shampoo, toothpaste, tooth brushes, razors, shaving cream, deodorant, socks and gloves). Some of you donated materials to this effort as well. We have provided 50 Faith Bags to Vanessa Hale who coordinates Medical Care in the camps and she has/is distributing them. We were fortunate to have a relationship with her to enable this.

That is about it for this years work by our Migrant Ministry. We at St. Mary and St. Francis have a new Pastor, Father Roger Adadano who comes to us from the Eastern Shore where he has extensive experience ministering to Migrant Workers. He has a plan for starting a Faith Formation program in the camps which I think is very exciting and I look forward to it.

Again I apologize for not updating you sooner. I am sure we will be ministering to the Migrant Workers next year in a more normal way. As always we sincerely appreciate your support in this ministry. We could not do it without all of you. God Bless you,
