

Memorable Moments in Diocesan History To be published each week of the 200th anniversary liturgical year

Since 1921, the bishops of Richmond had wished to serve the city in which they resided by erecting a Catholic hospital. In 1937-39, an official diocesan commission confirmed the need for such a hospital. Throughout the 1940s and 1950s, the diocese sought in vain to locate and purchase the land needed for the hospital and to find a religious order to run it. Bishop Russell again solved the problem. In October 1959, the Sisters of Bon Secours agreed to run the proposed hospital, and in January 1966, St. Mary's Hospital of Richmond opened to the public.
