

This painting of Jesus preaching in the synagogue at Capernaum is the work of the Polish-Jewish artist Maurycy Gottlieb (1856-1879). He depicts Our Lord with earlocks, and wearing the traditional talith or prayer shawl. In Gottlieb's painting Jesus is preaching to a mixed crowd - including one woman standing alongside the men and not in the section reserved for female members of the congregation. The painting can be found in the National Museum [Muzeum Narodowe] in Warsaw.


