
Nice Selection of Books and Tapes For All Hoping to Start a Library

-NEW- Examples of Clericalism, showing the aberration of both clerical and lay roles: A lay person passes up an opportunity to share his faith with a neighbor thinking only ordained people are fit to do so. A priest feels entitled and above the law as he behaves inappropriately. Laity, experiencing a mistaken sense of piety and deference, adopts a role of passive bystander rather than active participant, considering themselves less worthy or beneath ordained people. A bishop considers it more important to protect the reputation of the institution than to protect the people through transparency, accountability, and justice.
