

Reflections from Fr. Jim

Elitism vs Solidarity

As I often mention, the Franciscan theologian Richard Rohr, because I like his teaching about the fractured ego. The ego the truth about ourselves is broken as a consequence of Original Sin. The truth about how we see ourselves is clouded and we don't want to be honest about our shortcomings. Instead, the ego medicates itself by putting others down an comparing. "I am not as bad as _." (fill in the blank). Or, "I am certainly better than _." (fill in the blank again).

We can often think we are better if we have more money and hang out with the "upper class" crowd. The broken ego also prevents us from keeping our own side of the street clean and looking at others' moral failures so we do not have to work on our own. It plays out in religion, too. "My daughter hangs out with "unsaved" youth."

Roman Catholics can be elitist when it comes to the "real presence." "We have the real presence of Christ and they do not." First of all, can you define the "real presence of Christ"? Second, are you going to try to tell Jesus he cannot be present to the other Christian churches? What's that all about?

Such is the case in the early church. In Paul's letter to the Corinthians, he talks about rivalry. Some follow Cephas' style of worshiping Christ. Some follow Apollos' style. Others even follow Paul's style. (I'm sure Paul is not pleased.) They forget that they are supposed to follow Christ. Cephas, Apollos and Paul are real cool guys, but they point to Christ.

How about a little solidarity instead of elitism, ego and competition? Why not sit down and compare theologies? Why not find out the common ground? To do that, one must put the ego aside. Some day soon I would like to sit down with my friend, Rev. Brad Wilson, from New Prospect Baptist Church in Hurt and Rev. Adam Tyler at First Baptist Church in Farmville and talk about how we all experience Christ in the Lord's Supper or the Eucharist. It might not open up our table just yet, but it would create solidarity in one Lord, one Baptism an one God and Father of all. It would cause me to put my broken ego aside.
