Theological Moment with Fr. Jim

"I'm Still Standing"

"You know I'm still standing better than I ever did, Looking lilke a true survivor, feeling like a little kid. I'm still standing after all this time Picking up the pieces of my life..." (Elton John)

There are times that the greatest witness is not the one who is successful, but the one who never gives up; perseverance endures. I think of Ernie Banks of the Chicago Cubs. He never made the playoffs or had gone to a world series but played for over 15 years. He was known as being cheerful, though his team often had a losing record. With an efficacious smile, his favorite saying was "Let's play two!" He eventually did go to the Hall of Fame. He was still standing.

I enjoy the saying "The race does not always go to the swiftest, but to the one who keeps on running." It is an explicit powerful witness when one does it for the Lord. Reading Paul's letter (1 Cor. 2:1-5), he tells us that he was not the most eloquent speaker. Moreover, he came with very little confidence, but he still CAME to them when sent by God.

We can look at Paul's life - shipwrecked in Acts 27 [I wrote a paper on that at Catholic University] in prison several times, kicked out of towns hostile to the Gospel, second guessed by Peter (Cephas) and James. Paul led with his weakness to connect with those who were weak. He was finally executed but his message and Good News prevailed!

This is not human wisdom, but the Power of God.

E- Paul tells us that this identity is in Christ. When our identity is Christ, we stand and we do not stand alone, even and especially in death.

Like Elton John and despite what life has thrown at you, are you still standing?
