Can you believe that he likes the food there? He tells me about the new chef who does not use too much seasoning. Of course, it is helpful that he goes out two to three times a week. My brother Patrick takes him to restaurants and my sister Kathy takes him sight seeing. The coast, bay and ocean front can be attractive even in the midst of winter.
