The mission, so promising and the best thing that ever happened to us seemed to be cut short - cut short as he, who showed us and fired us up was cut down! The image he provided of a Lord God was loving and Mother that was nurturing, healing and forgiving. He showed inclusivity to lepers, adulterers. Roman occupiers, enemy collaborators. He provided so much promise. The image he provided of the caring Father who explored Canaanite territory was empathic and challenging about the hypocrisy of righteous religious leaders.
