A PASTORAL MOMENT WITH FR. JIM

I loved the song "We Are The World, We Are The Children" from 1986. What an endeavor it was to get all those American pop singers together. They worked through the night as a team. They heeded the message to check their ego at the door as each one was so popular: Madonna, Bruce Springstreen, Willie Nelson and Harry Belafonte - just to name a few. I found one fault. Willie Nelson sang: "A God has shown us by changing stone to bread..."

In the Gospel of Luke 4:1-13, Jesus is tempted to change stones to bread. Bue he doesn't do it. Instead, HE becomes bread to us - Bread in the Eucharist and the Lord's Supper but in many more ways than we can count! And, we are called to feed the "hungry heart" because as the boss (Bruce) tells us, everyone has one.

This Lent, our two parishes are challenged to first make amends. I have sins that involve food. I eat too much of it. What if I gave away the money to someone in need instead of buying a fish sandwich? (It is a lot of money these days.) If I eat out less, perhaps in some ways prices would drop so others can feast. How about our Lenten packets. Have you shopped yet for Mac's Kitchen or St Phoebe's Pantry?

Back to the hungry heart again. Mother Teresa did not want anyone assisting her in her program that had a child or relative at home hungry for love. Sometimes for me, it is easier to "run away" and be with the poor than to deal with some mess in the home.

Earlier, when I was a younger priest, I assisted with a ministry to the homeless. I would sleep in the shelter with them. It got a lot of compliments and affirmation. Meanwhile, there was another priest in my house with whom I did not get along. His heart was hungry. I needed to patch things up there before I spent my nights in the shelter.

The Word of God means not only giving food for the body, but food for the soul.
