

A PASTORAL MOMENT WITH FR. JIM

The late Bishop Sullivan was a man who could think outside the box. One of his favorite sayings was "We are a missionary diocese. We do not get stuck in our ways." Another saying was "We are church in new ways!"

Bishop Sullivan realized the expertise and the emergence of women into leadership roles within the church. He saw competent women leading religious education programs leading prayer as well as teaching adults. He could see that there would be less priests and more parishes to cover. He also realized that while all priests could minister the sacraments, not all were capable of being pastors. Pastoring requires unique skills. But, there were qualified women who were capable of pastoring, so he appointed women to pastor parishes. At one time there were seven parishes and missions lead by women with degrees in theology, pastoral ministry and valuable life experiences.

The sacraments were covered by a priest who was not far away. The priest appointed had a good attitude and was comfortable with not being "the boss." In most cases this worked out very well.

Of course, Rome gets nervous about some lay leadership and especially women pastors So after Bishop Sullivan retired, one by one the parishes were taken over by priests. The women did "too good" of a job and made fools of the misogynous hierarchy. The lay people were asking serious questions about the sexual discrimination against women in the sacrament of Holy Orders. You could almost hear the voice of Tom Cruise from "A Few Good Men" - "You can't handle the truth!"

One pastoral coordinator for me stands out. Her name was Theresa Mansfield. She pastored parishes in Crewe, Meherrin and Blackstone. She received the Bene Meritas Award from Pope John Paul II. It was the highest award given to a lay person. Theresa served 32 years in her position. She passed away Holy Week this year.
